

Enriching lives, opening minds.



The Erasmus+ Study Programme allows students to spend a continuous study period at a **European or non-EU university that has an agreement with the University of Perugia.**

During the mobility period, students may attend **courses, take exams, carry out thesis work and internships**, with the guarantee of **full recognition** of the learning activities successfully completed abroad, provided that they are approved within the framework of the **Learning Agreement.**



Eligible countries:

EU Member States and Third Countries Associated with the Programme (EU): Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Iceland, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Republic of North Macedonia, Malta, Norway, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Czech Republic, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Turkey, and Hungary.

Third Countries not associated with the Programme (non-EU): please refer to the List of partner institutions and mobility flows – Third Countries not associated with the Programme (non-EU).

IMPORTANT

Participation requirements

- a) Being **regularly enrolled** at the University of Perugia in the current Academic Year;
- b) Not receiving, during the same Erasmus+ study mobility period, a European grant provided by other mobility programmes funded with EU funds;
- c) Students who have already completed a study or traineeship period under the Erasmus+ Programme may apply for this call provided that they do not exceed a total of 12 months, including those already completed within the same study cycle (or 24 months in the case of a single-cycle Master's degree).



Student status at the University of Perugia must be **maintained for the entire duration of the Erasmus+ study period.**

Obtaining a degree or the qualification required by one's study programme before or during the study period abroad will result in the **loss of the Erasmus grant** and the obligation to repay the funding received.



Compatibility with previous Erasmus+ experiences

Students who have already completed a study or traineeship period under the Erasmus+ Programme may apply under the following conditions:

- a) If enrolled in the **same study cycle** in which the Erasmus+ mobility was carried out, **the total duration of mobility must not exceed 12 months, including the months already completed** (24 months in the case of a single-cycle Master's degree);
- b) If enrolled in a **study cycle different** from the one in which the Erasmus+ mobility was carried out, **the total duration of mobility must not exceed 12 months** (24 months in the case of a single-cycle Master's degree), **excluding the months already completed** in the previous study cycle.



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Study programme abroad

The study activities for the mobility period are agreed upon prior to departure with the home university and the host university through the Learning Agreement, which specifies the educational activities the student will undertake at the partner university.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION: For the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 programme, Learning Agreements must be managed online. Higher Education Institutions can do this by using the [Online Learning Agreement platform](#) or an equivalent system connected to the Erasmus Without Paper Network. Therefore, this template is provided by the European Commission for information purposes only and must not be used to manage Learning Agreements for studies. 

Language skills

In the application, candidates must indicate their level of proficiency in the **language of the host country** or in the working language, which will be considered an evaluation criterion by the Selection Committee, as provided for in Article 7.





Language skills

Assessment criteria:

- Language placement tests successfully passed at the UNIPG Language Centre (CLA) within the last two years;
- International language certifications valid as of the application deadline;
- Language exam passed as part of the applicant's degree programme.



Mobility period

Selected students may carry out their mobility at the host institution between **June 1, 2026 and July 31, 2027**. An Erasmus student may request an extension of the period abroad from the Department Erasmus Coordinator, subject to the approval of the host university, at least one month before the end of the initially planned mobility period.

The extension period may not be extended beyond July 31, 2027.

Types of mobility

LONG-TERM PHYSICAL MOBILITY


Long-term mobility is intended for all students enrolled in Bachelor's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes, PhD programmes, Specialisation Schools, and Master's programmes of the University. This type of mobility must have a **minimum duration of 2 months and a maximum duration of 12 months**, and its duration is established by the inter-institutional agreement signed between the University of Perugia and the host university.



Types of mobility

SHORT-TERM PHYSICAL MOBILITY

It is also possible to undertake short-term physical mobility lasting **from 5 to 30 days**, which must always be accompanied by a virtual mobility period (with the exception of short-term mobility within PhD programmes, where the virtual component is optional but strongly recommended).





Mobility grants

The Erasmus+ Call for Study Mobility provides **funding** exclusively for **eligible activities carried out abroad**, including:

- European Union grant (short- and long-term physical mobility);
- European Union grant for students with fewer opportunities;
- Additional monthly grant provided by the University (excluding students enrolled in Specialisation Schools and PhD programmes);
- Lump-sum travel grant;
- Top-up of the European Union grant funded by the Italian Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR) (students enrolled on time or out of course for no more than one year);
- Grant for students with special needs;
- Possible monthly supplementary grant from A.Di.S.U.

LONG-TERM PHYSICAL MOBILITY

The monthly amount (the same for all non-EU countries, with the exception of the United Kingdom and Switzerland) is €700.

Additional grants – Students with special needs

Students with special needs participating in mobility programmes may apply for an additional grant from the **Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE** through the International Relations Office of the University of Perugia.

The University also provides an additional monthly grant of €500 for students on mobility with a disability of 66% or higher and/or a recognised disability status (Article 3, paragraph 1 and/or paragraph 3, Law 104/92), as recorded in the ESSE3 system.



Applicants must indicate in the online application **three host institutions**, in order of preference, selected on the basis of the Inter-institutional Agreements listed in the List of partner institutions and mobility flows – EU Member States or Third Countries associated with the Programme (EU) and in the List of partner institutions and mobility flows – Third Countries not associated with the Programme (non-EU), with reference to the **disciplinary area (ISCED Code)** indicated for each destination.


Please note that compliance with the disciplinary area is mandatory, as it determines the learning activities that may be carried out at the partner institution.

Selection criteria

Candidates are selected by the Department Erasmus Committees.

The selection of **students enrolled in Bachelor's degree programmes, single-cycle Master's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, and Master's programmes** is carried out on the basis of the following criteria:

- a) **the total number of credits** earned, in relation to the total number of credits required by the study plan;
- b) **the average grade** of all exams passed by the student and, for students enrolled in Master's degree programmes, the grade obtained in the first-cycle degree;
- c) **language skills**;
- d) **a description of the study project** that the student intends to carry out at the selected host universities and its relevance to the student's study pathway at the home institution.





Selection criteria

The selection of **students enrolled in PhD programmes and Specialisation Schools** is based on the following criteria:

- a) the number of **academic years taken by the student to complete the study programme** required for admission to the PhD or Specialisation School in relation to the standard duration;
- b) the **degree grade** obtained by the student in previously completed study programmes and, where applicable, the grades achieved in exams taken within the PhD programme or Specialisation School of enrolment;
- c) **language skills;**
- d) **a description of the study or research project** that the student intends to carry out at the selected host universities and its relevance to the student's study or research pathway at the home institution.
