

## CURRICULUM VITAE

- Prof. Camillo Pieramati was born in Terni in 1961;
- in 1980 he obtained the high school diploma with 60/60 (Classical studies);
- in 1986 he graduated in Veterinary Medicine at the University of Perugia with 110/110 cum laude;
- in 1990 he obtained his PhD in "Increasement, Hygiene, Healthiness and Quality of Animal Productions";
- in 1990-1991 he ranked 1<sup>st</sup> for the scholarships awarded by the Agricultural Science Committed of the Italian National Research Council, and he realized his project on genetic evaluation of livestock at the Department of Animal Science at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln (USA), under the guidance of Prof. Dale L. Van Vleck;
- in 1991-1992 he was chosen by the Italian Experimental Institute "Lazzaro Spallanzani" in Milan to carry out studies and research on the genetic improvement of the horse;
- in 1992, after winning a competition for a university researcher position (group G06 - "Animal Husbandry and Feeding"), he took up service at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Perugia;
- in 2000, he was declared eligible as associate professor of Animal Breeding and Genetics at the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Molise, and after this he was called by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine of the University of Perugia;
- during different academic years, he has been responsible not only for teaching at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, but also at Faculty of Agriculture and at the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery of the University of Perugia. The main topics of his courses were animal breeding, veterinary genetics and genetic improvement of livestock, but his teaching also spread to biometrics, statistics for life sciences, medical statistics and information technology for the animal sciences;
- he currently works at the Department of Veterinary Medicine.
